1. Applicants must be residents of and work in Australia, New Zealand, Fiji or Norfolk Island.

2. The QUOTA SPA Scholarship is valued at \$7,000. The Sheila Drummond Bursary is to the value of \$4,000.00. The scholarships are available for observation and discussion of methods, short-term study, or work experience in these areas or other parts of the world.

3. Applicants may have academic or non-academic qualifications. Professional and voluntary workers are eligible for selection and must be aged 25 years and older.

4. The Winners will be notified by March 2012 and must travel by 30th December 2012.

Celebrating 30 Years of QUOTA Scholarships 1981–2011

Important information regarding the Quota South Pacific Area Scholarships for work in the Fields of Speech and Hearing. Please read these points and address them in your application.

1. These scholarships are sponsored by the united clubs of the South Pacific Area of Quota International Inc., which is an organisation whose members are of diverse occupations and are committed to give personal and financial service to the community at local, national and international levels.
2. Major importance is given to service to the Speech and Hearing Disabled people of the community and it is envisaged that the broad structure of the scholarships will relate to Quota's Service to all age groups in all socio-economic classes of all nations.
3. Specifically the programs undertaken will be for all purposes associated with human verbal communication in the total areas of its development and disabilities and their management. The full scope will include research, education, medicine, therapy, community education and support in its complete social sense in relation to the disabled people and those caring for them.
4. At present the Quota South Pacific Area Clubs are in Australia, New Zealand, Fiji and Norfolk Island and candidates for the scholarship are required to be working in the fields of Speech and Hearing in these areas at the time of application and must be aged 25 years and older.
5. The object of the awards is to give successful candidates the opportunity to participate in projects, to observe methods, and to take part in discussion with other workers concerned with the needs of verbal communication disabled people.
6. It is envisaged that the successful candidates may range from parents or voluntary workers involved in the establishment of support groups, teachers, doctors, nurses, therapists, scientists or any worker involved in the fields of hearing and speech care.
7. The value of the scholarships will be a maximum of \$7,000 and the successful applicants must satisfy the members of the Selection Committee that the work will be undertaken and be of benefit to the members of the community to which they will return at the conclusion of the scholarship term.
8. Usually scholarships will not be awarded to candidates who wish to extend personal academic qualifications.
9. There must be an agreement that the successful candidates will return to the fields of work in the areas for which their original applications emanated and that full reports will be presented to the Scholarship Central Committee at the conclusion of the tenure of the scholarships
10. The application forms provide for the formal requirements of the members of the Selection Committee and these and further information may be obtained by writing to the Secretary at the above address.
